



River Tweed Wildlife

The Tweed supports many different types of wildlife, including mammals, fish and birds. Mammals are warm blooded and give birth to live young. Most birds can fly, have feathers and produce eggs. Fish live in water, mostly produce eggs and are cold blooded.

Descriptions

I live in the water, I have scales and fins. I breathe through gills and am cold blooded. I produce eggs.

You can find my type on land or in the water. I have hair or fur and normally have four legs although I can have flippers. I produce live young who I feed with milk and I look after them until they are old enough to look after themselves. I am warm blooded and breathe air.

I can fly and am covered in feathers, I am warm blooded and produce eggs. When the eggs hatch I look after my young until they are ready to fly the nest.
